El Paso County voting system (Dominion software version DVS 5.13) violates C.R.S. 1-5-601.5, 1-5-603, 1-7-802, 52 USC 20701, and 2002 Voting Systems Standards sections 2.2.11, 2.2.5.1, 2.2.5.3, and 2.2.5.2.1(e), and 2.2.4.1(h), as set forth in the attached Amended Verified Petition and Exhibit 1, Declaration of Doug Gould.

The El Paso County voting system is illegal because normal operation of the system destroys electronic files that federal and state law require voting systems to preserve for audits, recounts, potential prosecution of election crimes for violations of civil rights, and for public trust in the voting system; and because, before an election, updating the system software in the trusted build procedure destroys records of previous elections that federal and state law require computer voting systems to preserve. Accordingly, it is illegal to continue to use the voting system. Please see attached Amended Verified Petition of Timothy Kirkwood, and Exhibit 1, Declaration of Doug Gould, Exhibit 1.1, Resume of Doug Gould, and Exhibit 2, DOJ Publication 7/28/2021 requiring retention of electronic voting systems records.
